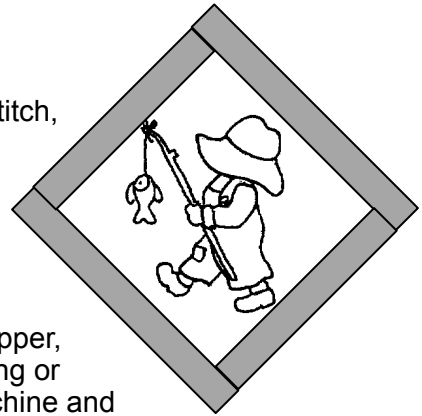


APPLIPLAY© - Overall Sam = #1

Fusible Applique with Hand or Machine Buttonhole Stitch
Using fabric design to mimic real-life objects; couching

SUPPLY LIST:

- Sewing machine in good working order if it has a built-in buttonhole stitch, otherwise you can make the buttonhole stitch by hand
- Small iron, if you have one (mini-iron is too small for this project)
- Optional: teflon pressing sheet
- Firm "Ironable" surface
- Double-sided fusible web: Steam a Seam2® is great!
- Small, sharp paper scissors and good fabric scissors
- Usual sewing supplies: 70/10 or 80/12 needles, straight pins, seam ripper, neutral thread and bobbin filled with neutral thread, Size 40 topstitching or decorative thread for buttonhole stitch (black is traditional). Both machine and hand methods need a sharp hand needle. Hand buttonhole stitchers need embroidery needle, embroidery floss or #8 perle cotton in choice of color (black is traditional).
- .5mm mechanical pencil
- 1 yd. background fabric plus colorful fabric scraps and embellishments for 4 blocks. Sam's hat could be a basket-weave print; his overalls could be denim. Wood grain fabric could be used for his "fishin' pole."
- Small embroidery hoop
- **13" X 13" cut background square rinsed, dried and pressed with spray sizing or starch.**

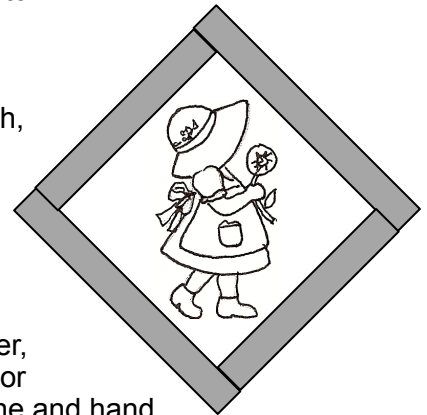


APPLIPLAY© - Sunbonnet Sue = #2

Fusible "Window" Applique with Hand or Machine Buttonhole Stitch
Adding embellishments, making yo-yo's and broderie perse

SUPPLY LIST:

- Sewing machine in good working order if it has a built-in buttonhole stitch, otherwise you can make the buttonhole stitch by hand
- Small iron, if you have one (mini-iron is too small for this project)
- Optional: teflon pressing sheet
- Firm "Ironable" surface
- Double-sided fusible web: Steam a Seam2® is great!
- Small, sharp paper scissors and good fabric scissors
- Usual sewing supplies: 70/10 or 80/12 needles, straight pins, seam ripper, neutral thread and bobbin filled with neutral thread, Size 40 topstitching or decorative thread for buttonhole stitch (black is traditional). Both machine and hand methods need a sharp hand needle. Hand buttonhole stitchers need embroidery needle, embroidery floss or #8 perle cotton in choice of color (black is traditional).
- .5mm mechanical pencil
- Fabric scraps and embellishments for block. Sue's hat could be a basket-weave print. A piece of ¼" ribbon could adorn the hat. She might have a little lace petticoat peeking out from under her skirt. Use your imagination to add more charm to this beloved traditional pattern
- Small embroidery hoop
- **13" X 13" cut background square rinsed, dried and pressed with spray sizing or starch.**

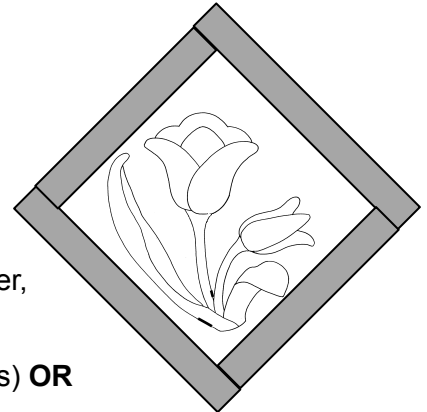


APPLIPLAY© - Tulip and Bud = #3

Freezer Paper Applique with a Machine Straight Stitch
Using Freezer Paper as Iron-on Templates

SUPPLY LIST:

- Sewing machine in good working order
- Clover mini-iron or substitute
- “Ironable” surface
- Roll of freezer paper **plus 12” X 12” square of freezer paper to trace pattern**
- Small, sharp paper scissors and good fabric scissors
- Usual sewing supplies: 70/10 or 80/12 needles, straight pins, seam ripper, bobbin filled with neutral thread, etc.
- .5mm mechanical pencil
- YLI Nylon Thread (Smoke for dark or bright fabrics; clear for light fabrics) **OR**
- Colored threads to match patch fabrics
- Fabric scraps for block.
- **13” X 13” cut background square rinsed, dried and pressed with spray sizing or starch.**



APPLIPLAY© - Songbird = #4

Freezer Paper/Glue Applique with Mock Hand Stitch by Machine
Making easy bias stems and a trapunto heart

SUPPLY LIST:

- Sewing machine in good working order that does zig-zag stitch
- Clover mini-iron or substitute
- Firm “Ironable” surface
- Roll of freezer paper
- Cotton ball, cosmetic puff, or small pinch of poly stuffing
- Small, sharp paper scissors and good fabric scissors
- Stick of washable fabric glue (not restickable glue stick)
- Usual sewing supplies: 70/10 or 80/12 needles, straight pins, seam ripper, bobbin filled with neutral thread, etc.
- .5mm mechanical pencil
- A few toothpicks
- YLI Nylon Thread (Smoke for dark or bright fabrics; clear for light fabrics) **OR**
- Colored threads to match patch fabrics
- Fabrics for blocks.
- **13” X 13” cut background square.**
